GEORGIA DOME HOSTS BANDS OF AMERICA MARCHING BAND CHAMPIONSHIP SATURDAY OCT. 30

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE – Outstanding high school marching bands from throughout Georgia, Alabama, Tennessee, North Carolina, South Carolina and Florida as well as Mississippi, Arkansas, Louisiana, Illinois, Ohio, and Maryland will compete in one of the nation's most prominent marching band championships, Music for All's Bands of America (BOA) Super Regional Championship, presented by Yamaha, at the Georgia Dome on Saturday, October 30. The dome is located at 1 Georgia Dome Dr. NW, Atlanta, Georgia. The Allatoona High School band program and boosters are hosting the event.

The 34 high school marching bands will perform in preliminary competition, evaluated by a panel of nationally recognized music educators and marching band experts. The top scoring bands will advance to the evening finals competition, where the Super Regional Champion will be named. The Western Carolina University marching band will perform in exhibition at the conclusion of preliminary competition at 5:00 p.m.

"The marching bands performing in this BOA Championship are some of the finest and most talented in the region, including former Regional Champions," said Travis Tester, Manager of Participant Relations for Music for All. "The thousands of student performers have worked long hours and dedicated themselves to the pursuit of excellence in preparing for this event."

Gates open on Saturday for prelims at 7:00 a.m., with competition beginning at 7:30 a.m. and the presentation of awards at 5:15 p.m. Gates open for finals at 7:00 p.m. with the first finalist band performing at 8:00 p.m. Awards will be presented at 11:15 p.m.

Ken Stanton Music is the event's official music store and instrument repair provider.

Tickets are available through TicketMaster.com and at the Georgia Dome ticket office on the day of the event. Ticket prices range as follows: \$19 Prelims, \$23 Finals General Admission, \$28 Finals Reserved, \$34 General Admission Day Pass to Prelims and Finals and \$39 Deluxe Day Pass (General Admission Prelims and Reserved Finals). All children ages 10 and under are free for general admission seats. These ticket discounts are available at the gate on the date of the event: spectators 11-18 years old and college students can attend the prelim or finals for \$7 off any general admission ticket type and \$3 off any reserved ticket type. Seniors 62 and over get \$3 off the applicable adult ticket price, as do active duty military members and their spouses (military ID required).
